This is the last newsletter for the academic year 2017/18. Where has the time gone? It has been another fantastic year at Marsden and once again we celebrate the achievements of our learners. Let's take some time to reflect on what has been happening in school for the last few weeks...

<u>SATs:</u>

The Year 6 preliminary SATs results were published on Tuesday 10th July. Once again, our learners have done well and our results 'subject to validation' were either above, in line or just below National. Year 6 learners sit public examinations for Reading, Spelling and Grammar and Mathematics. In Mathematics they are tested on their speed in answering arithmetic questions, their general understanding, and their reasoning skills. In Reading they focus on higher order comprehension skills, spelling always has difficult words. In Grammar learners have to identify various features of sentences and punctuation.

Our Chair of Governors Mrs Ruby Anwar said "Wow, yet again Marsden SATs results are good and we now need to strive even higher. Well done to all the teachers and children".

Mrs MacQuarrie jumped up with pride when she saw the results and congratulated her colleagues and children throughout the day.

Some learner comments include:

"I was really happy when I got my SATs results and I am thankful to all the teachers who helped me achieve. In January I was not At Expected in reading but in my SATs I scored 107 – yippee"

"I was overjoyed with my SATs results especially with my reading because I struggled with my reading but with all the boosters, I was able to achieve greater depth".

"I was extremely happy when I got my results, the teachers helped me a lot with my work, especially Mr Boult and Mrs Macquarie".

"I was shocked when I got my SATs scores as I wasn't expecting to do as well as I did. I want to thank all of the staff in year six for helping me this year. Thanks also to all the previous teachers who have helped me build up my confidence".

"Before getting my results I was scared, but I was extremely happy when I got them".



A huge thank you to the Year 6 team, Mr Boult, Mrs Macquarrie, Miss Hourigan, Miss Kelly, Mrs Thompson, Mrs Ali and Mrs Preston who worked tirelessly to make SATs as stress free as they possibly could.

Year 6 learners were not the only ones to have completed their SATs. Our younger learners in Year 2 also went through a similar process with very pleasing outcomes. Mrs Fenna and Miss Bailey said, "We are so proud of Year 2 for putting in so much effort and believing in themselves. Even when the work became challenging – they never gave up!"

Our Year 1 learners undertook their phonic assessments and again our results were extremely positive – the highest so far! Learners in EYFS have made exceptional progress this year.

All learners have made progress this year (as I am sure you would have seen in your child's report). We have a skills-based Marsden Curriculum which is linked to the needs of our learners. Our aim is to always make the curriculum exciting so that our learners are motivated because motivated children make fantastic learners.

I am indeed proud of all our learners and extremely thankful for the efforts made by all staff to ensure that Marsden offers your children the best opportunities to fulfil their dreams and potentials. Thank you to all parents for giving us the privilege to teach your children.


EYFS Graduation

Increased price for School Dinners

Lancashire County Council have made the decision that all school dinner prices will be increased from September 2018 from **£2.20 per day to £2.30** per day. School dinners from September will now cost **£11.50** for the full week rather than £11.00. Please can all parents ensure payment is made on a weekly basis to avoid large debts.
