This week in 3M we have started lots of new and exciting learning in maths we have been beginning to use the grid method we had to multiply a teen


number by a one digit number firstly using arrays and then moving onto numbers we have also been practicing recalling our 3,4 and 8 multiplication

Girls Football Final

After qualifying back in November, our Girls' Football Team once again travelled to FisherMore High School to play in the Pendle Schools Final. Initially, they played a match against Park Primary, the final score was 2-0 to Park but the girls were not disheartened. They then went on to play Christ Church and drew 0-0 but in the final game they were victorious over Laneshaw Bridge with a 1-0 score. Overall they finished in second place.

It was a fantastic achievement to reach the final but to finish in second place is something that the girls should be really proud of.

The Girls' Football League starts on Wednesday 1st April and hopefully they can build on their successes over the last few years.

Athletics B Team Competition

Twelve Year 5 pupils went to Pendle Vale College to compete in an indoor athletics competition. They took part in two Field Events selected from the following categories: Javelin, Standing Long Jump, Standing Triple Jump, Chest Push, Vertical Jump and Speed Bounce.

Following the Field Events, all members of the team took part in the Track Events – competing in the one lap sprint relay; two lap sprint relay; six lap round and a relay event. Although each event split the team into boys and girls, the overall winner was determined by the number of points gained. The girls' team finished in second place with 264 points and the boys' team finished in fourth place with 258 points. Overall, the team finished in third place with 522 points.

This was a fantastic result for the Year 5 children at Marsden since the majority of the other teams were made up of children from Year 6. Well done to everyone involved!

Badminton

Twelve pupils from Marsden attended Nelson and Colne College to take part in a badminton event which involved an element of competition but also had a fun focus. Those involved received some extra coaching.

In the competition there were two teams made up of four children (2 boys and 2 girls).

Marsden Team A got off to a winning start, beating Wheatley Lane but, unfortunately, they were then beaten by Gisburn Road. Marsden Team B lost to Gisburn Road and Earby in the opening two games.

When Marsden Team A played against Marsden Team B, it was Team A that won and finished in third place with Team B finishing in fourth place overall.

Everyone worked hard throughout the Spring Term to improve their Badminton skills by attending the weekly Badminton Club so should be very proud of themselves.

It was very pleasing to see excellent sportsmanship throughout the competitions.
