At Marsden Primary, we regard the safeguarding of children as our main priority. We believe that we all have the right to be happy, to be safe and to learn. We all have the responsibility to make this happen.

We will ensure that:


- 1. The welfare of our children remains paramount.
- 2. All children whatever their age, culture, disability, gender, language, racial origin, religious beliefs and/ or sexual identity have the right to be protected from harm.
- 3. All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately.
- 4. All staff and volunteers working at our school have a responsibility to report concerns to the Designated Leads for Safeguarding.

Our safeguarding policies cover all areas of school life and include:

- Staff & Visitors- ensuring they are vetted, informed & trained.
- Children's Behaviour- promoting safer & happier behaviours & lifestyles.
- Parents & Carers- promoting links & supporting families.
- Premises -keeping them safe, pleasant & fit for purpose.
- · Curriculum -providing positive learning experiences.

We recognise that very young children and those with Special Needs or disabilities have equal rights to protection. Adults in school, in charge with their care, follow the school's Intimate Care Policy and procedures. Maths Champions

On Wednesday 18th October a group of 4, Year six pupils took part in the UKMT (United Kingdom Mathematics Trust) competition for Primary Schools at Colne Primet Academy. Aaminah, Ayaan, Laiba and Yousaf did remarkably well, finishing 3rd out of 8 teams.

The competition consisted of several rounds including group, speed, shuttle, cross number (like a crossword but with numbers) and culminating in a frantic relay round. Our team came top in the speed round but due to a lack of time, our favourite, the logic round was dropped.

All the competitors enjoyed a day of maths and growing their brains with challenging problems. Keep practising your maths skills – in future years it could be you.

Breakfast Club

This term in Breakfast club we have been trying a variety of new foods which the children requested. Children were given the opportunity to try porridge, spaghetti, spaghetti hoops and a variety of jam flavours. Healthy eating is our aim because we believe a good filling breakfast has great impact on children's learning. Attendance

Please can you ensure that you do not book your holidays during term time. Your child/children will miss out on learning that they will **not be** able to catch up on. Any tickets booked in advance of seeing me will be unauthorised. The Attendance Policy can be found on the website. Please take some time to read it as it is very clear when requests for time out of school can be authorised and when they can't.

As a school, we are judged by Ofsted on our attendance. All schools must have a target of 96% attendance on a weekly basis. By not taking a holiday, you are supporting the school in achieving the Government's target. All children who have 100% will be rewarded termly with a special reward given at the end of the year. The class with the highest percentage is rewarded weekly.
