I was shocked to see that some children have only read 2 to 4 books since September. It is vital that they read every night if they are to make good progress with their reading. You will receive a letter from your child's teacher if your child hasn't read a sufficient amount of books.

# Closure of school due to severe weather on Friday 15th December



During severe weather conditions we make every effort to keep the school open for as many children as possible. However, in some circumstances, following completion of a risk assessment, we may decide that it is necessary to temporarily close the school. Reasons may include:

- Too few staff members able to reach the school, or advice is issued against travelling
- Risk of injury to pupils, staff or visitors due to the weather conditions
- A failure of the school's heating systems

In such circumstances we will always attempt to give parents and carers advance notice, but due to the unpredictable nature of some weather events this may not always be possible.

On 15<sup>th</sup> December 2017, following consultation with our Governing Body and completion of the risk assessment, I regrettably had to take the decision to close the school. This was due to icy and dangerous weather conditions.

As stated in our Severe Weather Policy, we communicated information about the closure before 8.00am via our school website, the Local Authority's Website, 2BR radio and a personal text message to all parents.

I'd like to thank you all for your patience and understanding. Decisions to close the school are never taken lightly but, unfortunately, may sometimes be necessary for the safety and wellbeing of the school community.

## Winter School Uniform

If children walk to school in boots or wellies, they need to change back into their school shoes once inside the building. Please also note that only black shoes are acceptable for both boys and girls.


