I hope by now you have all had a chance to read our OFSTED report which confirms that we are a "Good School".

I am very pleased that the HMI inspector recognised the progress that has been made. Among the comments the inspector noted a number of very positive achievements, including:

- Children are at the heart of everything that your school does. You and all your staff strive to ensure that all pupils achieve their very best.
- All pupils make strong gains in their learning. In 2016, the progress that pupils made in writing at key stage 2, including those who are disadvantaged, was outstanding.
- Provisional results in 2017 show that progress in writing and mathematics is very strong at key stage 2, particularly for disadvantaged pupils.
- The proportion of pupils reaching the expected standards in reading, writing and mathematics is now above the national average.
- Pupils are delightful and a credit to the school and their families. Overall, behaviour around the school is impeccable and pupils look really smart in their school uniform, which they wear with pride. Relationships at all levels are respectful.
- Outdoor learning is particularly popular with all pupils. They relish the wonderful opportunities they have to make dens, boats and volcanoes from the natural materials found in the nearby woodland area.
- High priority is put on keeping pupils safe.
- Current attendance figures are in line with the national average.

These comments give Marsden a very positive platform on which to continue to progress and make further improvements in order to fulfil the huge potential that exists here to create a unique educational setting.



<u>Attendance</u>

In the Ofsted Report, it stated that our attendance was in line with National (96%) at the time of the inspection. Sadly, last week we dropped to 93% which is below National. This figure is largely due to illness and I wish all the children who are off sick a speedy recovery!

I have also had a number of families requesting extended leave in order to have a family holiday. Reasons for this have been cheaper tickets. Please note that Lancashire County Council have said that Headteacher's no longer have the authority to authorise leave. One of the reasons is because when your child isn't in school they miss out on learning and they find it difficult to catch up. Please also be aware that we have recently been instructed by the Council to remove a pupil from our school due to their absence. Family holidays should only be booked during the designated school holidays. The Holiday lists are attached to this newsletter.



In order for us to sustain good and work towards outstanding we have to maintain our attendance to be above or in line with National. Attendance plays a very important role in the way in which we are judged both by Ofsted (every 3 years) and regularly by the Local Authority. We therefore need **ALL** parents to work with the School to maintain and exceed expectations. I will continue to put the children's education first and any request for leave will not be authorised!

Sports Hall and Meeting Room Hire


