It has been an extremely cold week and after assessing the risks, I made the decision to close Marsden on Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday as it was not safe for children to come to school. In addition, staff living outside of the local area were unable to get into school due to hazardous driving conditions. This would have meant that there would not have been enough staff to supervise and cover classes.



I thank everyone for their co-operation with regards to these closures.

In the event of this happening again, please can I urge you to wait until you get a text message before you phone the School or the Chair of Governors. As a School we follow the following procedure:

- A risk assessment starts to be undertaken by 7:00am.
- A decision to remain open or to shut is made between 7:30am and 7:45am. I make this
 decision along with the Chair of Governors.
- If the School is going to close I phone Lancashire County Council to let them know the risk factors and to then get permission from them to shut the school.
- Mrs Arif will send a text message to staff and parents before 8:00am. If situations change, like they did on Wednesday, then a late text message cannot be avoided.
