Coronavirus impact on SATs 2021:

In recognition of the challenges posed by the pandemic the Department of Education has cancelled the following statutory assessments:

- Year 1 Phonics Screening
- KS1 SATS for Year 2 and Year 6 pupils
- Year 4 multiplication tables check.

Primary Performance data will not be published again this year but teacher assessment in Reading, Writing and Maths at KS1 and KS2 will remain. Parents will be informed of these teacher assessed levels in their child's end of year report. KS1 and KS2 teacher assessments in Science will also be cancelled for 2021.

I would like to thank you once again for your incredible support during this year. We have all had to make changes to the way we once used to do things and I thank you for cooperating with the changes school has had to make. Please remember we are here for you and there will always be someone who will be able to help you.

On that note, some things in school have not changed and this includes our adherence to policy. In particular our Attendance Policy which can be found on the website. Please note that as previously stated, school attendance is mandatory and no leave of absence will be granted unless deemed as exceptional.
